

STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY ANALYSIS (2018-2019)

Students Satisfaction Survey on curriculum and teaching learning process has been used towards the improvement in the quality of course delivery as well as student learning processes. For the academic year, student feedback is sought from 468 students about the curriculum and teaching-learning process.

Feedback Analysis Report

Most of the students were satisfied with the various aspects of the teaching like coverage of syllabus, teaching methodology followed in the institute, promotion internship, student exchange, field visits opportunities and ICT tools usage etc.

76% of the students acknowledged 85-100% coverage of the prescribed syllabi. For curriculum delivery Revised Bloom's Taxonomy is strictly enforced in the institute. Teachers inform well in advance about expected competencies, course outcomes & programme outcomes. 83% of students have expressed satisfaction in this area.

The student Mentoring system in the Institute facilitates cognitive, social & emotional growth of the students, providing multiple opportunities to learn and grow. The Mentor does a necessary follow-up with assigned tasks. About 85% of students have expressed satisfaction on the mentoring system adopted in the Institution.

Students have been enabled to identify their strengths and weaknesses; also they have been extended all help to enhance strengths and overcome weaknesses. 76% of students have expressed satisfaction.

89% of student expressedsatisfaction on the use of ICT tools and 79 % on the efforts made by the Institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, Life skills and employability skills of the students.

76% of students expressed satisfaction on the student's centric methods like participative learning, experiential learning etc.












17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.


